

# Block of the Month for February

## Wild Goose Chase

Here is block number eleven of our block of the month quilt. This is one of the more challenging blocks in this quilt, but it is well worth it! It is made up of Triangles and one Square, which makes a very interesting cross design.. The block is made up of three fabrics, the background, the Wild Geese, and their Background fabric. Each letter on the diagram represents a fabric. **Note** that there is one diagram for the  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares which are cut out of both A and B fabrics. Use the diagrams on the right side to guide you when cutting out the pieces. If you have questions please call me at 408-264-7121. Email [cbooton2@comcast.net](mailto:cbooton2@comcast.net). ### Cutting:

#### Goose Fabric A

1. Cut eight (8)  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " by  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Squares and the cut each square diagonally once, a total of 16 triangles.
2. Cut one (1)  $3\frac{5}{16}$ " by  $3\frac{5}{16}$ " square for center of block.

#### Background Fabric B:

1. Cut two (2)  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " by  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares and cut each square diagonally once,
2. Cut one (1) square  $9\frac{3}{16}$ " by  $9\frac{3}{16}$ " and cut diagonally twice, a total of four triangles.

#### Goose background Fabric C:

Cut eight (8)  $3\frac{3}{16}$ " by  $3\frac{3}{16}$ " squares and then cut diagonally twice for a total of 32 triangles.

### Assembly:

Follow the diagram to the right.
