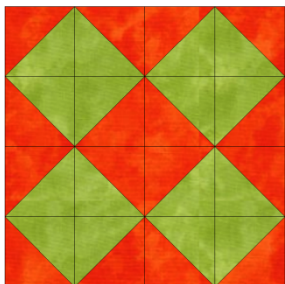
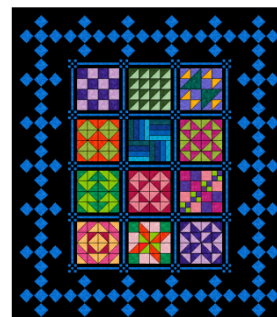


**Four Patch Variations
Block of the Month

The new Block of the Month quilt is constructed of all four patch block variations. Each month I will give you the directions for a 12" by 12" block that you might use to construct your own four patch quilt or, as I have done, you can construct a quilt using all 12 blocks in

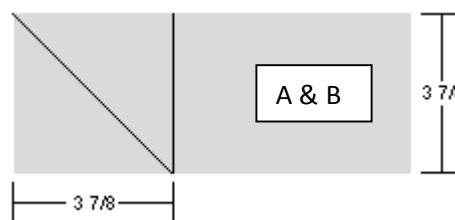


this series. The patterns are for you to use with any fabrics you wish. I used Moda color wash prints to create an Amish quilt. The border is constructed of nine patch blocks, with the second color matching the border (black). This makes them appear as if they are floating on the quilt. Cutting:

Cut eight 3 7/8" by 3 7/8 " squares from fabric A (orange). Cut diagonally once. You will have 16 rectangles.

Cut eight 3 7/8" by 3 7/8 " squares from fabric B (green). Cut diagonally once. You will have 16 rectangles.



Assembly:

Follow the diagram, first piece A & B (outlined in red) to make a square. Repeat three more times. Sew the four squares together to create a square. Make sure you follow the color layout represented by the green outline. Make three or of these square and then sew them together following the color layout. You will have a four patch variation titled **Mosaic**.
