Minutes of the General Meeting
May 23, 2022
Virtual Meeting via Zoom

Welcome: President Callista Bevins called the meeting to order at 9:32 AM. She briefly reviewed Zoom etiquette.

Announcements: Callista has recently sent out an email announcing the Boutique Sale on Saturday, June 11 from 10 to 1 at the Westhope Presbyterian Church in Saratoga. She reminded members that it would be outside with little shade and to bring hats, water and chairs. Fabric will be sold by the paper grocery bag at \$15 a bag.

Nominating Committee: Marie Strait reported that the committee was still looking for nominees for two jobs. She explained that the Third VP for Programs was a fun job where the occupant gets to help with the web search for and contact teachers for the year.

Community Quilts: Robin Scheiderer reported that 68 quilts have been donated in the last month and listed the recipients and read some of the thank you notes. In July we will hear from Audrey Esarey from Kentucky with an evening lecture on Modern Quilting and workshop the following Saturday.
